Fish Prepared

Know conditions and have the proper license(s).

Fish No Trace

Leave the river better than you found it and pick up trash and poop.

Fish Respectfully

Catch and release with barbless hooks. Keep your distance from other anglers.

Fish 'em Wet

Minimize fish handling time out of the water when taking photos or videos. A wet fish is a happy fish.

Fish Aware

Be mindful of others at the put in and take out, and park appropriately.

Fish Supportive

Say howdy to other anglers and communicate with kindness—it goes a long way!

Fish Inclusive

Entry to fishing can be hard for people who didn't grow up with the sport. Make it easier by helping others hone their skills and understand ethics.



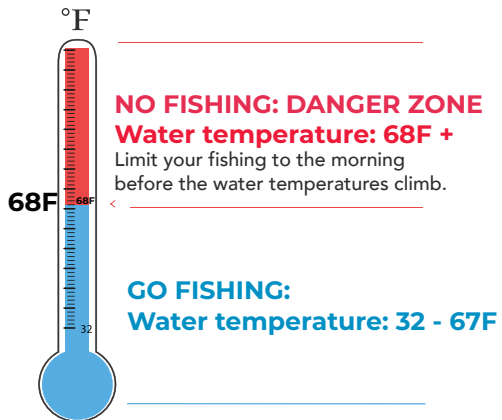
Respect Private Property
